




Test 3 Task 1

The pie charts illustrate the proportions of the populations of Yemen and Italy in different age ranges in 2000 with the projections for 2050. The charts show people were divided by age into three groups as children with age 0-14, middle-age people with 15 to 59 years of age, and elderly people with over 60 years of age.

In 2000, about half of Yemen's population were children and only 3.6 percent of people in the country were their age over 60. While almost one-third of Italians were in their mid-age range, and there was a much bigger proportion of elderly people in Italy than in Yemen with around 24 percent. The smallest group of population in Italy was the children which accounted to around 14.3 percent.

From the regressions of population segments in 2050, it shows the rise in the average age in both countries. Yemen's population will have smaller percentage of children and it will shift to the mid range instead. Nevertheless, the percentage of children in Yemen will still outnumber the Italian population with 37 percent in Yemen compared to 11.5 percent in Italy. The number of elderly people will dramatically increase up to around 42 percent of the Italian population.

The middle-age people will be the dominant age group in both countries with over the half of the population in Yemen while it will come to 46.2 percent in Italy.

Chart cannot divide people in different age groups, therefore, it is wrong to word your sentence in this manner.

Here, you are comparing different things. For Yemen, you reveal data for children and elderly and then compare it with mid-age range and elderly Italians. This is incorrect way of comparison. You must compare children and elderly population demographics of both countries. Also while has been wrongly used as a cohesive device. Rephrase it like this:

Whereas, a much bigger proportion of Italian population comprised of elderly people (24.1%) and children were the minority age group in the country at only 14.3%.

What do you mean by regressions of the population? Rephrase it:

The population projections for the year 2050 show rise in the average age in both the countries.

You have written "different measures are also required" which is wrong because these measures are not in addition to building sports facilities.

It is wrong to say - people have improved public health. Health of a population collectively is referred to as public health.

The second paragraph is unnecessary and not directly relevant to what has been asked in the question. You simply need one paragraph to suggest how sports centers can improve public health and a second paragraph to explain why this is not enough and what other things can be done.

You have said that sports centers are best for improving public health. But in the introduction you said that sports centers will not be that effective. So what is your opinion? You are confusing the reader and this spoils your CC and TR. At the end of this paragraph, you have said that it is quite costly to build fitness centers. I guess you want to highlight this as its drawback but it needs to be framed better. Also, this point is not convincing enough. A solution can be costly but it does not mean that the solution will be ineffective in solving the problem. This will not fetch you points in TR.

In this paragraph, the first two sentences have similar meanings. This is redundancy. There are too many ideas in this paragraph and none of them are sufficiently explained.
